7-8 year olds **April 4**

9-10 year olds **March 28**

NO PREVIOUS TRAINING NECESSARY

Online audition pre-registration is required.
There is a \$35 fee for auditions at SAB.

Applicants who wish to audition at SAB must register online in advance of the audition date and schedule a specific audition time on the applicable date.

2017-2018 Winter Term classes begin in September for 8 to 10 year olds and in October for 6 and 7 year olds. ♦ Girls should wear a leotard or swimsuit and boys should wear shorts (no long pants) and a t-shirt to the audition. ♦ Children must be 6-years-old by 9/1/17 to audition and enroll for the 2017-18 Winter Term. ♦ Tuition assistance is available.
